Today we are celebrating the 250th Anniversary of the arrival of the English Ships bringing emigrants for the newly-established settlement of New London in the summer of 1774! They settled in the area around and to the west of New London Bay. Some of the settlers and their descendants went on to establish the Anglican Parish of New London, including initially building St. Thomas' Church in Spring Brook and later St. Stephen's in Irishtown; with early members of St. Mark's, Kensington, and St. Elizabeth's, Springfield, also having early connections. Our Parish-wide Worship Service this morning will honour and recognize that history.

Many of the settlers and their descendants played important roles in the early establishment of our province, and many can trace their Island roots back to the events of that summer. In recognizing that, community events are planned for this afternoon from 1:30-4:30, including period displays, period games for children, light refreshments, and historical talks, with Q&A's and breaks in between, specifically: 2:00 pm-Early Anglicanism on the Island of St. John's (Thomas Haslam); 2:45pm- The New London Settlement (John Cousins); 3:25pm- The social and economic context of settlement (Dr. Edward MacDonald QC); 4:05pm- The legacy of the arrival (Dennis Cole LEM and Revd Shirley)

The Parish is deeply grateful to the 250th Anniversary Committee, comprised of Doreen Cole as Chair, along with Grace MacLeod, Gail Carr, Doreen Childs, Lola Meek Ogilvie, Dennis Cole LLM, and Rev. Shirley. We thank them for their many hours of work and sharing their passion and expertise for history and the church.

A READING FROM JOSHUA 4:1-9

(New Oxford Annotated NRSV)

When the entire nation had finished crossing over the Jordan, the Lord said to Joshua: "Select twelve men from the people, one from each tribe, and command them, 'Take twelve stones from here out of the middle of the Jordan, from the place where the priests' feet stood, carry them over with you, and lay them down in the place where you camp tonight." Then Joshua summoned the twelve men from the Israelites, whom he had appointed, one from each tribe. Joshua said to them, "Pass on before the ark of the Lord your God into the middle of the Jordan, and each of you take up a stone on his shoulder, one for each of the tribes of the Israelites, so that this may be a sign among you. When your children ask in time to come, 'What do those stones mean to you?' then you shall tell them that the waters of the Jordan were cut off in front of the ark of the covenant of the Lord. When it crossed over the Jordan, the waters of the Jordan were cut off. So these stones shall be to the Israelites a memorial forever." The Israelites did as Joshua commanded. They took up twelve stones out of the middle of the Jordan, according to the number of the tribes of the Israelites, as the Lord told Joshua, carried them over with them to the place where they camped, and laid them down there. (Joshua set up twelve stones in the middle of the Jordan, in the place where the feet of the priests bearing the ark of the covenant had stood; and they are there to this day.)

<u>PSALM 23</u> (BCP, pg. 356-357)
