Follow up from Parish Council

Thank you to all of you who completed the recently distributed Survey. This was regarding the proposal recently passed at PC to survey the congregations regarding having 1 Service at 10 a.m. each Sunday in January, February, and March -- rotated monthly among the three Churches open in winter. The Surveys were counted by Revd Shirley and myself, and recently shared with the Parish Council Executive before making public. The results are as follows:

65 surveys were completed.

St. Mark's - 18 Surveys - 17 Y - 1 N

St. Stephen's - 26 Surveys - 22 Y - 4 N

St. Thomas' - 21 Surveys - 13 Y - 8 N


Therefore, Surveys from all 3 churches showed a majority of Yes votes. And 80% Yes and 20% No overall.

It was agreed that if there was a majority voting Yes from each church, the Proposal would go ahead.

There were some surveys that included additional comments, which will be reviewed at the next PC Executive Meeting along with the overall results. At the next Parish Council Meeting the details will be finalized and implications discussed to bring this into effect for January, February, and March, 2026. 

A READING FROM WISDOM 3:1-9

But the souls of the righteous are in the hand of God, and no torment will ever touch them. In the eyes of the foolish they seemed to have died, and their departure was thought to be an affliction, 3 and their going from us to be their destruction; but they are at peace. For though in the sight of men they were punished, their hope is full of immortality.
